Children and Youth

A life-changing decision to follow Christ is most often made before age 18. Camp Wingmann provides children and youth a place and time away from phones, the Internet and video games to encounter Jesus, learn about The Lord, own their faith, and share their prayers and thoughts among friends. Camp Wingmann hosts hundreds of campers entering grades 3 through 12 each summer.

The camp also hosts weekend youth retreats for middle and high school groups throughout the year as well as other groups from churches and other ministries. The seeds of faith are planted and nurtured with every child, youth, adult, staff or volunteer who participate and lead camps and retreats throughout the year.

Leadership

The seeds of faith planted with campers grow. Youth advance from counselors-in-training to junior then senior counselors, and then Assistant Director to learn to handle serious responsibilities and develop as leaders. They learn to articulate and share their faith in Jesus with their peers and the campers. Their "camp family"

becomes an ongoing source of encouragement and accountability – a critical element of discipleship. They carry their faith through college. Many grow to lead other ministries such as Bible studies, Sunday school and youth groups. Some have been called to serve on their church vestries and search committees. New in 2018, former counselors are now serving as Summer Camp Director, Bookkeeper and Maintenance Director at the camp. Faith and leadership are gifts that they will carry into any vocation or endeavor. The blessings of Camp Wingmann roll on indefinitely.





Needs

The Diocese of Central Florida sold Camp Wingmann in 1980. When the camp was reacquired in 1998, every building was in terrible shape and required major renovation. To date, buildings that have been rebuilt and/or renovated include: all 6 cabins, Louttit Lodge, All Angels Chapel, the Retreat House, Director's Residence, Cottage, Duplex and Lakefront building. and an upgrade of its audiovisual capabilities. It needs restrooms and secure storage for equipment. It would also be the best location for camp offices and a welcome center. All renovations will retain the camp's rustic feel and simple functionality – as we have done with the cabins.

This renovation will extend Yates Hall's life for decades to come. It



The next step is renovating Yates Hall, the physical and programmatic heart of the camp, to preserve and prepare it as the central gathering point of camp life. It is the primary location for registration, programs, instruction, small group discussions, dances and closing ceremonies of summer camps and retreats. Its walls breathe with history, covered with the names of campers and staff dating back to the camp's earliest days. While that heritage must be preserved, it is also over 70 years old. It needs reinforcement of its floor joists, new flooring, insulation, lighting

will retain its hallowed, historic first impression for campers and visitors at registration and improve its capacity as a venue for educational, program and social functions. Adding bathrooms will resolve the current major inconvenience of having to leave the building to use a restroom. (Children have to be escorted as well.) If funds allow, moving the offices to Yates Hall will make them much more accessible to visitors and parents at the center of the camp while freeing the current office space for other uses.

Cost

The full cost of completing essential renovations to Yates Hall, including relocation of offices and driveway repairs, totals \$552,000. A generous lead gift of \$275,000 from the Holy Trinity Episcopal Church Foundation in Melbourne, Florida, has moved us well on our way toward reaching this goal. Today, the camp seeks your support to complete this important project. As with every other renovation that we have completed, the camp will use its pool of skilled volunteers as much as possible to minimize costs and stretch every dollar.
